Over the years, this person has contributed to the demolition derby, parades, livestock areas, antique tractor pulls, building repairs, modifications and improvements, and various competitions for both children and adults. The only area you might not find this person helping is with the chicken show. While this person enjoys listening to the talent of the mini theater, to our knowledge they have never been on stage, yet!

Like an excited kid in a candy shop, this person can be seen months ahead of time on the fairgrounds preparing for the big day! In their early volunteer days, this person had been in support roles, always willing to help out and learn from other well-seasoned volunteers. Now, as a well-seasoned volunteer themselves, this person has taken on leadership roles including being a superintendent and helping educate the public on historic practices and equipment.

When conversing with this person and trying to solve a problem, you'll hear "Now, wait just a minute" as this person comes up with just the right part, piece, nut or bolt you have been looking for, or just gives your idea the shot in the arm it needed.

He has built to scale weight pulling sleds and pedal tractors that both kids and adults enjoy during a healthy fun filled competition each year. He can be seen daily tending to the model building where many of his fully functioning hand-crafted models are on display. He also tends to and maintains models from passed volunteers that have donated their models to the fair.

This person has the best kept secret in Allegany County, having their very own antique museum with restored tractors, a full size & mini stationary hay press, antique farm equipment and garden tractors, a variety of hand tools and everything in between right down to the original burlap feed sacks hanging on the walls.
